

## Call for Participants: TNS Neuro Quiz 2026 (TNQ 2026)

The **Thai Neuroscience Society Neuro Quiz 2026 (TNQ 2026)** aims to honor high-achieving students by providing them with the opportunity to participate in an exciting national and international neuroscience competition. The next generation of leaders in neuroscience will be encouraged through dynamic and interactive learning.

Participants will engage in a series of intellectually stimulating quiz rounds designed to promote active recall, critical thinking, and the application of knowledge. Scenario-based questions will challenge students to connect theoretical concepts with real-world contexts, enhancing both understanding and problem-solving skills.

Two progressive rounds will be organized:

- 1. Elimination Round Competition (Online):** The top 10 finalist teams will be listed.
- 2. International Final Competition (Onsite):** One winning team will be selected.

Each round increases in difficulty, offering a rewarding and challenging experience throughout the competition.

The top 10 finalist teams will be awarded sponsored one-night accommodation to compete in the International Finals, held onsite during the TNS29 Conference at **Amari Bangsaen, Chonburi, Thailand, on August 5, 2026**. The accommodation will be provided for one night on August 4, 2026.

This is a unique opportunity to showcase your knowledge, gain valuable experience, and connect with peers who share a passion for neuroscience.

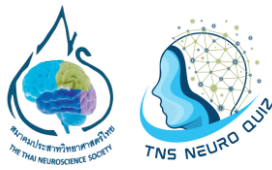

### Eligibility:

1. Open to all public, private, and parochial high schools in Thailand and international schools.
2. Participants must be students currently enrolled in Grades 10-12.
3. Each team must include one officially appointed coach or teacher, assigned by the school's principal or director.
4. Each team must consist of two primary student members.
5. Each school is allowed to register an unlimited number of teams.

### Judging and Integrity:

All responses will be evaluated by a panel of experts in neuroscience to ensure fairness and academic rigor. Any form of dishonesty or plagiarism will result in immediate disqualification.



## Registration:

1. Each team must consist of a coach (teacher) and two student members from the same school. If the coach is not a faculty member of the school, official documentation from the school is required to verify the team's eligibility for participation.

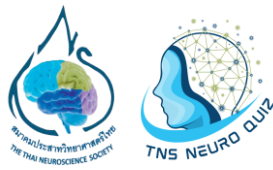
## Code of Conduct:

Participants must demonstrate excellent sportsmanship, showing respect to judges, organizers, and fellow competitors. Any use of inappropriate language or disruptive behavior will result in a warning or disqualification.

## General Structure of the Quiz Format:

The competition will be conducted in two rounds:

1. **Elimination Round** – Conducted online through a Zoom meeting: **Live Kahoot platform** and **MCQs bell-ringer exam** to identify the top 10 finalist teams based on their highest combined scores.
2. **International Finals** – Conducted onsite at TNS29 conference at Amari Bangsaen, Chonburi, Thailand, on August 5, 2026, to select the winning team.



## Elimination Round (online):

### Rules

1. All registered participants are required to join the Zoom meeting using their unique team ID, followed by their full registered name (i.e., TNQ-01-CU-Full Name). The unique team ID will be communicated to the registered email address.
2. Participants must join within the scheduled time. Late arrivals (over 5 minutes) will be disqualified.
3. Zoom meeting recording will monitor participant behaviors for any suspicious activities.
4. Participants are required to remain in a well-lit environment, ensuring that no other individuals are visible within the camera frame. **Both webcam and microphone** must remain active for the duration of the competition.
5. No external assistance is allowed. No other person may participate or help in any form.
6. In the event of connection issues (e.g., disconnection, lag, frozen screen, or disruptions caused by phone or LINE calls), no extra time, pause, or compensation will be provided under any circumstances.

### Regulations

1. Participants will be evaluated through **Live Kahoot** and the **MCQs bell-ringer exam** (conducted online via Google Form) in the Elimination Round to identify the top 10 finalist teams.
2. Each team member may complete the **individual examination independently** or **collaboratively with their teammates**; however, all responses must be submitted individually. The team's final score will be determined by combining all submitted answers.
3. All participants are required to use two devices: **(1) a PC, Mac, or iPad** to join the Zoom meeting (with camera and microphone enabled) and view the MCQ bell-ringer questions, and **(2) a second device, such as a mobile phone or iPad**, to submit answers in real time via Kahoot and Google Forms.
4. Participants using mobile phones are strongly advised to use a Wi-Fi connection (by turning on airplane mode and turning off the voice calls of the LINE application and other communication applications) instead of mobile data to prevent disruptions caused by incoming phone or LINE calls.
5. Please verify that your internet speed is sufficient.



6. The video conference will be held via Zoom meeting; ensure that the Zoom application is installed on your device beforehand.
7. The TNQ 2026 organizers will provide the quiz links (Live Kahoot and MCQ answer form) during the Zoom session on the test date.
8. The example of the recommended textbook for the TNS Neuro Quiz will be provided as a guideline, but its content may not directly correspond to the examination questions.
9. The team's ranking will be determined by the combined scores of all team members. The highest total team score will determine the top 10 finalist teams.
10. The official results of the Elimination Round will be communicated via email and published on the official website. Participants are expected to regularly check their email for updates and announcements.

## International Final Round (onsite):

### Rules

1. The team's composition must only include an accompanying teacher (coach) and two students of each team from the same school as registered.
2. Participants must join within the scheduled time. Late arrivals (over 5 minutes) will be disqualified.
3. In the event of connection issues (e.g., disconnection, lag, frozen screen, or disruptions caused by phone or LINE calls), no extra time, pause, or compensation will be provided under any circumstances.
4. No external assistance is allowed. No other person may participate or help in any form except for students from the same team.

### Regulations

1. All participants are required to use **only one tablet per team** to submit answers via the MCQ Google Form and the live Kahoot platform.
2. Participants will be assessed through two types of questions onsite (MCQs and short-answer questions), administered via Google Forms and Kahoot during the TNS29 Conference at Amari Bangsaen, Chonburi, Thailand, on August 5, 2026.
3. Participants are allowed to use only the paper and pencil provided on their team's table to take notes. No additional materials or personal stationery are permitted.



4. The use of calculators, mobile phones, or any communication devices is strictly prohibited during the competition.
5. Any handwritten notes used during the competition must be submitted as instructed. Participants are not allowed to retain them after the competition concludes.
6. Team rankings will be determined based on the combined scores from Google Forms and Kahoot, with accuracy as the scoring metric.
7. No points will be deducted for incorrect answers.
8. The highest total score will determine the winners.
9. The official results of the International Final Round will be announced at the TNS Neuro Quiz 2026 Award Ceremony in the TNS29 conference on August 5, 2026, at Amari Bangsaen, Chonburi, Thailand.

#### **Awards, Prizes, Gifts, and Certificates:**

1. All certificates will be provided as digital e-certificates.
2. All participants will receive a Certificate of Participation.
3. In the final round, both files and printed copies will be provided for participants.
4. The top 10 teams advancing to the International Final Round who confirm their participation in the final round by the announced deadline will receive Certificates of Finalist and vouchers covering one-day event registration for the TNS29 conference (August 5, 2026). Further details regarding accommodation will be announced before final round confirmation.
